# My Rights & Responsibilities

# On admission to the custody/detention facility, a staff member should explain that you have the RIGHT:

- To be told your rights in language that you understand, and to be given your own copy of the Rights and Responsibilities pamphlet
- To participate in your religious practices
- To reasonable privacy and to have your own approved belongings (with limitations)
- To speak in private with, and receive visits from, members of your family (unless a court has restricted contact or where a visit would not be safe)
- To speak in private with, and receive visits from, your lawyer or another person representing you, the Ombudsman of Ontario, or a member of the Legislative Assembly of Ontario or of the Parliament of Canada

- To receive medical and dental care
- To participate in school and work
- To participate in athletic, recreational and cultural activities
- To be properly fed and clothed
- To send and receive mail. Your mail may not be examined or read if it is to or from your lawyer, the Ombudsman of Ontario, or a member of the Legislative Assembly of Ontario, or the Parliament of Canada
- To get the legal help of a lawyer to help with hearings and appeals

- To be consulted, heard and to participate in the decisions that affect you
- To a plan of care or case management/reintegration plan that meets your needs and to participate in the planning and any changes
- To not be physically punished



- To be told about the Ombudsman of Ontario and how to contact their office
- To be told how to make internal and external complaints
- To be told about the rules and the consequences for breaking the rules
- To be told about your responsibilities

# You also have responsibilities:

- To follow the rules
- To respect the rights of others
- To be involved in your case planning
- To work cooperatively with staff
- To respect the confidentiality and privacy of yourself and others.
